The different faces of Hospitality

Alcides Murtinheira

Recent international surveys have placed Portugal among the friendliest countries for expats to live. During the Second World War, in a remarkable spirit of solidarity, the Portuguese welcomed countless refugees from countries in severe conflict. However, in 1975 and 1976, when more than one million Portuguese citizens had to flee former colonies, due to devastating civil wars, many felt Portuguese hospitality was more myth than reality. In the 21st century Portugal is a lesser-known potential destination for refugees, but most of those who decided to stay feel comfortably integrated. Do the Portuguese welcome foreigners better than their returning fellow-citizens?

Afektivna gostoljubnost: sevdalinka in nove politike solidarnosti v Sloveniji

V razmišljanju o gostoljubju v kontekstu migracij prevladuje analiza »gostoljubnosti« dominantne kulture, ki bolj ali manj uspešno »gosti« migrante, begunce, začasne delavce, itd. V pričujočem prispevku bo perspektiva obrnjena. Prispevek namreč analizira, kako so bosanske begunske glasbene skupine v Sloveniji v devetdesetih letih s pomočjo specifičnega glasbenega žanra – sevdalinke, konstruirale novi dom. V tem procesu so se begunci transformirali v gostitelje, koncertni prostori - ki so bili oddaljenod utesnjujočih sob begunskih centrov - so s pomočjo afektivnosti glasbe postali prostori gostoljubnosti, solidarnosti in afektivnega povezovanja. Zaradi nove politike povezovanja jih je moč razumeti tudi kot prostore upanja, in sicer tako za izvajalce kot poslušalce.

Affective hospitality: sevdalinka and the new politics of solidarity in Slovenia

In the context of migration, the explorations of the hospitality are usually focused on the attitudes of the members of the »dominant« culture towards the »guests«, migrants, refugees, temporary workers etc. This paper follows different perspective and explores the process of music-making of Bosnian refugees in Slovenia in the 1990s as the process of home-making. With the particular musical genre – so called Sevdalinkas – members of the refugee music groups, managed to transform their roles. During their affective performances they became the »hosts« to the audience. In contrast with the suffocating rooms in refugee centres, the concert venues became the places of hospitality, solidarity, affective connections, but also places of the new hope for the future for both, listeners and performers.

On Hospitality

Maja Bjelica

Institute for Philosophical Studies, Science and Research Centre Koper

The talk will attempt to discuss the possibilities inherent to the arising of a new ethics of hospitality. It will present, analyse and offer an interpretation of actually (non-)existing circumstances and conditions that allow and enable hospitality to arise from intersubjective spaces. Attempting to answer questions such as "What is hospitality?", "Is hospitality always conditional?", "Where and when does hospitality manifest itself?", the research on this topic was carried out mainly in two scientific fields – philosophy and anthropology – but always interconnected with several other scientific disciplines, thus allowing for a deeper insight into the concept and phenomenon of hospitality.

O gostoljubju

Predavanje bo ponudilo uvid v možnosti vznikanja nove etike gostoljubja, osnovan na predstaviti, analizi in interpretaciji dejansko (ne)obstoječih okoliščin in pogojev, ki bi dovoljevali in omogočali širjenje gostoljubja in intersubektivnih prostorov. Z odgovarjanjem na vprašanja, kot so »Kaj je gostoljubje?«, »Ali je gostoljubje vedno pogojeno in kako?«, »Kje in kdaj se gostoljubje pojavlja?«, je bila ta raziskava izvedena predvsem na znanstvenih področjih antropologije in filozofije, ki pa sta venomer interdisciplinarno povezovani z drugimi znanstvenimi polji, kar dovoljuje globlji uvid v koncept in pojav gostoljubja.

Hospitality and migration in the border regions

How is hospitality understood in the context of contemporary migrations? How do local communities in Slovene and Bosnian border regions perceive hospitality in relation to migrants/refugees? Why are their acts of hospitality towards migrants/refugees increasingly criminalized? Uršula Lipovec Čebren, Tina Ivnik and their MA students from the Department of Ethnology and Cultural Anthropology address these questions in their short presentations, based on recent fieldwork research in two Slovene border regions and in Velika Kladuša, a border town in Bosnia and Herzegovina.
